Purpose of the LCLC:

Heysham joint site's Local Community Liaison Committee (LCLC) meets twice a year to provide a means for the Company to inform local organisations and members of the local community generally on matters arising from the operation of the power stations, including environment monitoring and emergency planning arrangements, on any new developments by the Company on or near the power station site or issues concerning the development of civil nuclear power in the United Kingdom and particularly nuclear safety issues as they may affect the local community.

To act as a means of liaison with local organisations and members of the local community generally on matters concerning the interaction between the power station and the local community including (by way of exclusion) infrastructure, employment, public information, transport and social questions.

Introduction

Richard Bradfield welcomed everyone to the Morecambe Community High School and explained that for this meeting the format would be a 'question and answer' style to a panel, with questions from the audience made up of LCLC members and students from the high school.

Pupils from the school put a series of questions and comments to the panel. Other members of the Heysham power stations team, including apprentices and graduates, also contributed to the discussion.

The questions covered: decommissioning, recruitment, the future of fossil and nuclear power, safety at the site, flooding, refuelling, and the difference between the sites, engaging stakeholders, and the health of workers on site, Heysham 3, costs of running the stations, site maintenance and shutdowns.
